Duane L. Thurner, 78 of Waupaca, WI passed away Tuesday, May 24, 2016. Duane was born on November 27, 1937 in the Town of Seneca, Shawano County, to the late Max and Lila (Mitchell) Thurner.

Duane graduated from Clintonville High School in 1955. He then proudly served in the U.S. Marines in 1956 till 1959. On May 23, 1959 he married Sharon LaLonde in Santa Ana, CA. Duane worked for ANR Pipeline, retiring 35 years later.
