Carol J. Ryczek, age 66, of Amherst, WI passed away suddenly on Sunday, January 14, 2018 at Ascension Saint Michael's Hospital, Stevens Point. Carol was born in Great Lakes, IL on January 22, 1951, the daughter of Arthur and Shirley (Olsen) Schaar. She married Thomas Peterson in 1969 and in 1973 they welcomed their son Ryan.
