Kenneth Hurst passed away peacefully on the morning of January 15th, in Waupaca, WI at the age of 86. Ken was born the second child and oldest son of Reverend Kenneth and Gladys Hurst. He graduated from Park High School Racine, WI; Carthage College, Carthage, IL; and the University of Wisconsin Medical School, Madison, WI.
