He could play the piano and the accordion by ear without ever taking lessons. David had a big heart and was always willing to help others whenever he could. He was a source of wisdom and sound advice for many people. David was gifted with the ability to listen well. When people talked to him, he really listened to what they told him and always cared enough to ask them about their situation when he saw them again. He was a member of a United Methodist Church for most of his adult life. He had a strong faith and he was completely ready for the Lord to call him home.

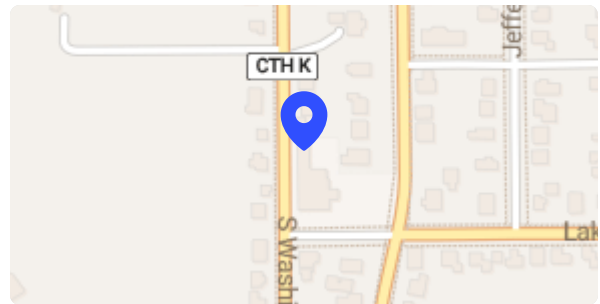

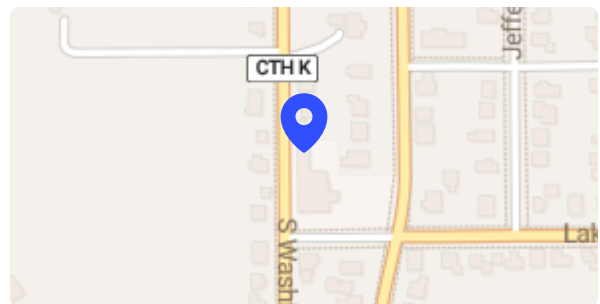
