Lloyd T. Havitz, of Amherst, WI, passed away at the age of 78, leaving behind a legacy of kindness, quiet strength, and an appreciation for the beauty of the natural world.

Born in Stevens Point on January 20, 1947 to the late Edward and Alma (Buelow) Havitz, Lloyd was raised on the family farm in Junction City. He graduated from P.J. Jacobs High School in Stevens Point in 1965. He went on to become a pipefitter in the central WI area. Lloyd lived most of his life in Amherst, WI with his wife Linda (Sook) Havitz, where he was known for his expert mushroom foraging, gardening, and his love for animals and the outdoors.

Lloyd is survived by his stepdaughter JoJo (Brad) Kleiber, granddaughter Kasey Connolly, step grandkids Clayton and Liza Kleiber, brother Elliot (Katie) Havitz, brother-in-law Virgil Seavers, many nephews and nieces including Pamela (Seavers) Thomson, who played a special role in his life.
